- 5.6 Mile Route - 3.85 Miles through Open Space Conserved in Perpetuity
- Westerly: Grills Preserve and Riverside
- Charlestown:

Issues:

- \$130 B Unfunded
- Higher Priorities:
 - Hudson Tunnel
 - NYC, Stamford and New Haven Chokepoints
- Open Space Conserved in Perpetuity
 - State, TNC and Town must defend
- Tunnel through Shumankanuc Hill slows train to < 100 mph
- CT. Home Values dropped 25%
