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Survey Results

Survey Background

The Town of Charlestown embarked on a two part process for a town wide survey. The goal of the first part of the project was to hear from the community what they believe are the major issues and topics that should be addressed or explored in the full survey. This was done by giving every resident and property owner a chance to participate in a "Pre-Survey" in which four questions were asked:

- A. What do you think are the three best things about living in Charlestown?
- B. What do you think are the three things most in need of improvement in Charlestown?
- C. What do you think are the top three most important issues facing the community of Charlestown?
- D. When you think about the town wide survey that will be coming from the Town in a few months, what topics do you think should be included on the survey?

These four questions were included on a tear-off postcard survey (see *Appendix B: Survey Mailer* for a copy of the mailing).

Pre-survey recipients were identified from the list of Charlestown registered voters and property owners from the assessor database. These lists were de-duplicated as best as possible, so that each voter or property owner would only receive one survey.

There were a total of 9,399 survey recipients. The survey mailer was taken to the post office for delivery on October 28, 2020. Recipients could complete the hard copy mailer and return it postage-paid, or they could go online to complete the survey. Data were collected through December 18, 2020.

In order to ensure only one survey was received per voter/property owner, a PIN was included on the survey. Very few duplicates were received, but for those where more than one survey was received, the one deemed to be most complete was used for analysis. A total of 893 completed surveys were received, for a response rate of 10%.

Respondents could answer each of the four questions in their own words. The verbatim responses to these questions can be found in *Appendix A: Verbatim Responses to Survey Questions*.

Responses were classified into broad categories; these results are shown in the graphs on the following pages.

Highlights

The natural resources of Charlestown (the beaches, green spaces, and ponds), the low taxes and the rural or small town feeling of the community were most frequently mentioned as the best things about living in Charlestown.

Six in 10 respondents mentioned access to the beaches and ocean as one of the top three best things about living in Charlestown (see Figure 1 on page 5). Low taxes was mentioned by more than four in 10 respondents (44%). Green spaces and the rural or small town feel of Charlestown were each mentioned by about four in 10 respondents.

Other positive aspects cited included compliments for the local businesses or lack of commercialization of the town, the quiet and peaceful atmosphere, the sense of community, the opportunities for recreation and other activities and events, the beauty and appearance of the community, the safety of the community, the quality of the schools, and accolades for the town government and the services it provides. Ninigret Park was specifically mentioned by many respondents who lauded the open spaces, parks and ponds. Among those who appreciated the small local businesses as opposed to big box or chain stores, the Corner Bakery and the Mini Super received particular recognition from residents and property owners.

The aspects of the community that were most likely to be cited as in need of improvement were traffic and speeding, lack parking or overcrowding at the beaches, growth management, and parks and recreation sites and activities.

About three in 10 respondents mentioned improvements to roads or reduction in traffic as needed improvements (see Figure 2 on page 6). About one-quarter of respondents mentioned beach-related improvements, particularly increasing access and relieving overcrowding. About two in 10 respondents indicated a need for parks and recreation improvements, or opportunities for recreational activities. Specific ideas included ball fields, places to walk or bike, an events center, and youth or family-friendly activities. (These are just a few examples.)

Twenty percent of respondents made comments related to managing growth, wanting to maintain a small-town feel by discouraging large developments, buildings with large foot prints or "chain" retail stores. Many expressed an interest in encouraging small local businesses.

Some residents indicated a need for more transparency in government and a civic public discourse. Some residents felt there was a need for improvement or expansion of some government services, and some desired to see the delivery of municipal water and/or sewer services. Housing affordability was mentioned by at 5% of survey respondents.

When asked what the most important issues facing the community were, balancing growth and supporting a local economy stood out as the topic most frequently raised.


Figure 3: What do you think are the top three most important issues facing the community of Charlestown?

About half of survey respondents made a comment related to growth management and/or local businesses (see Figure 3 on page 7). The next most frequently mentioned

topic was protecting the environment or natural resources, a topic addressed by about three in 10 respondents.

About two in 10 respondents made a comment related to water and/or sewer services, with some wanting to discourage public water and sewer services, but others wishing to see a public water and/or sewer system.

About 17% raised concerns related to the beaches, particularly overcrowding and lack of parking. Keeping taxes low was an important issue for 16% of respondents.

A number of other items were raised by respondents including affordable housing, maintaining the rural small town feel of Charlestown, parks and recreation, infrastructure improvements, school, traffic, climate change and sea level rise, and regulating or eliminating solar farms.

There were a wide array of topics that residents and property owners desired to see included on a town wide survey, including those mentioned as desired improvements or issues facing the community.

Most frequently mentioned were growth management and supporting the local economy with small local businesses (32%, see Figure 4 on page 8). Some mentioned including questions about the Comprehensive Plan or zoning, in particular.

Protecting the environment was high on the list, with one-quarter of respondents wishing for this topic to be covered on the survey. In particular, respondents desired for the Town to explore a land preservation fund, keeping the land stewarded, preserving salt ponds, or ways to restore/clean up natural resources.

About one-quarter of respondents (23%) thought questions related to parks and recreation should be included. In particular, respondents desired for a plan to be made for Ninigret Park with input from residents and property owners. However, there were a number of ideas related to recreation activities and use of parks mentioned by respondents.


Respondents felt questions related to beach issues should be included on the survey, especially regarding potentially restricting access to residents, lack of parking and overcrowding.

Topics related to governance were mentioned, although many of these were exhortations to keep taxes low. However, some desired to see the survey be used to get resident and property owner input on budget priorities, or how a budget surplus might be spent.

Many (13%) desired the survey to include items related to water and sewer issues. Other topics that respondents requested be included on the survey were affordability issues, roads and traffic, bicycle and pedestrian improvements, schools, safety, and climate resiliency and sea level rise.


Three best things about living in Charlestown

Figure 1: What do you think are the three best things about living in Charlestown?




Three things most in need of improvement in Charlestown

Three most important issues facing the community
